Remembering Logie

Logie Bruce-Lockhart was one of the most prominent and influential Headmasters in the long and rich history of Gresham's School. His 27 years at Gresham's are testament to that. However, it is much more than just time that displays his impact at the School: his attention to detail; his wide-ranging talents and the support and leadership he showed pupils and members of staff. This meant he left a lasting impression on so many who crossed his path (including those in Provence and Blakeney during succeeding years!).

Former pupils, members of staff and parents frequently attest to the crucially important influence which Logie had on them. More often than not he would see the potential in a young person to thrive at Gresham's and, should financial support be required in order to send their child to the School, he would do all that he could to ensure bursarial-based support was afforded to families that needed it. Many Old Greshamians (OGs) will recount how Logie was the reason why they came to the School; the opportunity was presented to them because of his, and the School's, generosity and vision.

It can safely be said that Logie Bruce-Lockhart lived a truly remarkable life – upon reading his biography, it would appear as though he lived numerous lives in one. Amongst many other values, what was particularly evident about Logie (before, during and after his time at Gresham's) was his commitment to supporting the many causes that were close to his heart and in the communities in which he resided, and providing opportunities for young people so that they might thrive at school and in later life – an ethos that remains at the heart of Gresham's

The School will forever be grateful for Logie Bruce-Lockhart's legacy and the great part that he played in making Gresham's what it is today.

Honouring Logie

On top of the many other ways in which Gresham's has honoured Logie-Bruce Lockhart, an endowment fund within the Gresham's Foundation was set up in August 2021 that will in perpetuity provide young people with the opportunity to come to the School as Bruce-Lockhart Award holders.

The Bruce Lockhart-Fund

The Gresham's Foundation Bursary Fund will continue to provide a vital stream of funding in support of the School's bursary provision. It is a restricted fund that provides both immediate support for bursaries and on an annual basis

The Bruce-Lockhart Fund will provide means tested support at Gresham's, in perpetuity. It is the first endowment fund of its kind sitting within the Foundation. The ambition is to grow a substantial fund that will have a significant impact on the School's ability to underpin its commitment to widening access and expand upon its growing bursary provision; it will support a growing number of young individuals who require financial support in order to attend Gresham's.

Creating such an endowment will allow the School to plan ahead with confidence, knowing that every year financial support can be awarded to young people irrespective of the many challenges that the private educational sector may face or the ever-changing economic climate and its impact on individuals and families. It will complement the existing Bursary Fund that so many members of the Gresham's community so generously support and which currently helps fund nearly 100 bursaries in the Senior School every year.

Fittingly, a fund of this nature will simultaneously acknowledge and recognise Logie's influence on OGs by forever awarding means tested support in his honour.

Bruce-Lockhart Awards

The School will be welcoming the first Bruce-Lockhart Award holder in September 2023; this is thanks to those of you who have generously supported the Bruce-Lockhart Fund.

Awards will be given to young people who show talent or potential in specific fields or areas of School life, whether academically, in sport or in the arts; they will be means tested and awarded where there is a demonstrable need. Importantly, the Awards will also go to local young people, thereby helping to widen access to a Gresham's education for people in Holt and the surrounding areas. The decision of who are awarded the prestigious Bruce-Lockhart Awards will, ultimately, be at the Head's discretion.

Pupils can expect a sense of pride and responsibility upon becoming a Bruce-Lockhart Award holder. Much like other bursarial and scholarship support at Gresham's, it is expected that Bruce-Lockhart Award holders will make the very most of what Gresham's has to offer, lead by example and show a high level of commitment throughout their time at the School. Once these pupils leave Gresham's they will join an ever growing cohort of former recipients who benefited from the Award, which will only add to the life-long association that they already have with the School.

The Bruce-Lockhart Fund – targets and impact

As of May 2023, more than £300,000 has been pledged to the Fund, which is a most heartening response by the Gresham's community to the first appeals for support. It is also a clear testament to the love and admiration so many have for Logie Bruce-Lockhart.

In order to support two Award holders at any one time, the fund will need to stand at approximately £400,000 – the Gresham's Foundation's next target. Looking further ahead, the goal is to have two Bruce-Lockhart Award Holders in each year of the Senior School – another very ambitious target to which the School aspires.

Simply put, the number of Bruce-Lockhart Awards that the School will be able to offer is dependent upon the ongoing generosity of the Gresham's community and the size of the Bruce-Lockhart Fund; the overarching aim is to build up a significant endowment fund that will support a growing number of Bruce-Lockhart Awards and in perpetuity.
